Successful Distribution


20 healthy goats (10 male, 10 female) were carefully selected and integrated into the households of the 10 beneficiary families. The goats were chosen based on their breed, health, and reproductive potential, ensuring a strong foundation for the families' goatrearing ventures.





Improved Animal Health and Welfare

The project emphasized the importance of animal welfare and provided training on proper care and hygiene practices. This resulted in a significant improvement in the health and wellbeing of the goats.

Potential for Disease Outbreaks: Goat rearing, like any livestock activity, carries the risk of disease outbreaks. To mitigate this risk, the project prioritized preventive measures, including vaccination protocols, hygiene practices, and early disease detection. Regular veterinary checkups were conducted to identify and address any health issues promptly.

Overall Impact:

The Goat Raising Project has had a transformative impact on the lives of the beneficiaries and the community as a whole. By providing a sustainable source of income, improving food security, and fostering community cooperation, the project has significantly enhanced the economic and social well-being of the families involved.



Future Recommendations:

- Marketing Support: Assist beneficiaries in marketing their goat products by connecting them with potential buyers, establishing partnerships with local businesses, and providing training on marketing strategies.
